At Abbey we build upon our pupils knowledge through the use of the Abbey Learning Cycle.

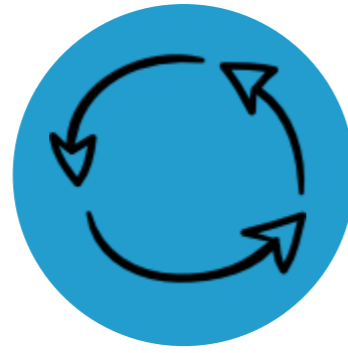
This promotes the use of Rosenshine's Principles to aid in the recall of learning, develop initial student practice and promote effective feedback. Over the page explains how we use this to develop learning

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Weekly and monthly review

Where does this learning fit in their sequence?



Independent Practice

Prepare and monitor students when they begin their independent practice .



Feedback and corrections

Think aloud
Ask questions and provide feedback .



Check previous work

Recall Strategies
Questioning



Present new content and skills

Present material using small steps
Provide models and worked examples
Scaffolds for difficult tasks



Initial pupil practice

Provide a high level of active practice for all students
Guide them as they begin to practice
