At Abbey we build upon our pupils knowledge through the use of the Abbey Learning Cycle.


This promotes the use Rosenshine's Principles to aid in the recall of leaning, develop initial student practice and promote effective feedback. Over the page explains how we use this to develop learning

Prepare and monitor students when they begin their independent practice .




#### **Feedback and corrections**




#### Present new content and skills
