6. ITEMS TO BE CONSIDERED	
6.1. Teaching & Learning Report	
Governors had received the T&L Report in advance of the meeting, which was overviewed by WA, and discussion/challenge was as follows:	
A Governor queried current attainment compared to pre COVID and WA explained year on year comparisons would be provided at the next meeting. WA also spoke about the historical peaks and troughs of Abbey's pupils, which links to delivery of the curriculum.	
A Governor queried the KS3/KS4 pupil's data and asked for more context. Is this due to higher number of pupils in KS3/4, which affects the %'s, or is it because they returned during lockdown and others did not and WA explained it is a mixture of both. KS3 struggled to engage with online learning and required hard copies of learning.	
A Governor asked if Maths is the subject, which has suffered the most, and WA agreed, explaining using and applying maths had suffered.	
[ID-B joined the meeting at 12:17]. 6.2. Behaviour Log	
Governors received the Behaviour Log and it was agreed that LW would provide Governors with the Behaviour Table following the meeting. ACTION: LW to share Abbey's Behaviour Table with Governors.	LW 06/07/21
LW shared with Governors the increase in pupils de-regulation but this forms a small number.	
A Governor commended the exemplary behaviour of pupils and asked if the introduction of the characters had assisted and LW explained about lessons learnt and how negative behaviour is unpicked and managed.	
A Governor asked how observing children are managed and supported when a significant Team Teach hold has been carried out and LW explained that 95% of incidents are supported via de-escalation; the rest of the class are removed or the child in crisis is. None of the team like holding and it is important to provide the child in crisis with dignity and support. LW also spoke about repair and reflection, which is more important than the actual restraint, because this makes or breaks relationships. Observing children are supported and very accepting of the behaviours of others. 6.3. Wellbeing Report	
Governors reviewed the Wellbeing Report.	
LW provided context regarding the long-term absence of three pupils. The Chair commended the efforts of school, as outlined on Page 3 of the report, in supporting pupils not attending. LW explained about the increase in holiday requests, which are responded to on a case-by-case basis.
